

Request for Ivins City RAP Funds Designated for the Arts

In 2014, Washington County voters approved a County-wide Recreation, Arts and Parks (“RAP”) tax imposed as a one-tenth of one percent (0.1%) sales tax. By Resolution 2015-03R, Ivins City Council determined that the City’s share of the County RAP tax revenues generally would be distributed in equal one-third shares between recreation, arts, and parks.

To apply to the City for RAP tax funds for the arts¹, an eligible applicant must complete and submit this application, including all delineated attachments, to Ivins City Arts Commission 55 North Main Street, Ivins, Utah 84738 by **December 31st** of each year. **Tax-exempt organizations proposing projects within Ivins City and Ivins City are eligible to apply for City RAP funds designated for the arts.**

Public notice of this meeting will be done in accordance with the City's usual and customary procedures. This will be an opportunity for each applicant to answer questions from the Arts Commission. In consideration of time and fairness, no presentations by applicants will be allowed during this meeting.
